Crisna came to Tallahassee in 2008 and since then has worked as the Inmate Programs and Re-entry Coordinator for the Leon County Detention Facility. As a committed Christian, the timing appeared divinely inspired when she joined the Board of Good News Outreach (GNO) who had recently opened a transitional home for women re-entering society after incarceration.

Logan brings to the board a passion for service and a strong educational and occupational background. After completing a double major in criminology and psychology, she worked as a substance abuse counselor and case manager at Gadsden Correctional Facility. She also earned a master's degree in business administration from Keiser University.

At the Leon County jail, Logan advocates for, and implements programs for detainees, including those who were recently released or who soon will return to the community. The service menu is big. It includes preparation for the GED exam, vocational training and substance abuse counseling, as well as classes in anger management, parenting, and more.

Sheriff Walt McNeil aims to provide former and current inmates with tools they need to be successful once released. Logan sees GNO's Mercy House program as important partners for the sheriff's office. She encourages Leon County residents to consider how they can help Good News Outreach with its re-entry program.

Logan is married to Khamon Logan, is a proud mother to Khalil, and a Native of Immokalee, in Southwest Florida.
